A Word from FACE Founder & Executive Director and FACE Chairman

Dear Friends of FACE,

2024 will remain an important milestone in the history of FACE, the opening of the National Kafala Center in May 2024, by FACE, in collaboration with the Ministry of Social Solidarity and thanks to the support of EMAAR MISR represented the achievement of one of our dreams.

The National Kafala Center is a new and unique project in Egypt, which centralizes the channels for receiving abandoned babies in the country, reducing baby trafficking, and contributing strongly to strengthen the system of placement into Kafala/adoptive families in Egypt, allowing many more children to grow up within caring families. The road is still long to close all orphanages in Egypt but FACE is confident that its new project is an essential step in the deinstitutionalization process in Egypt.

In contrast to this success, 2024 was a tragic year for the middle east region, with the War in Gaza and Palestine, in Lebanon and with the less mediatized but nevertheless tragic war in Sudan, which have both caused many victims and created important arrival of refugee populations in Egypt and in Cairo. FACE is not specialized in the support of refugees but has taken its part and helped at this level to provide support to refugee mothers as well as to the new-born babies coming from the Al Shifa Hospital in Gaza.

The economic difficulties that have effected Egypt the last few years have unfortunately continued in 2024 with very high inflation in the country. Food, educational costs, medical costs as well as transports costs are growing at a very high pace and FACE is as always highly mobilized in identifying new partners and new funding opportunities. The high inflation in the country affects first, of course, the poorest and most vulnerable categories of population. More and more children are dropping out of school and our teams have started to identify more and more mothers in street situations. FACE Outreach teams work force on the streets and in poor communities to contribute in creating safety nets and work on a very important element: prevention.

National Kafala Center preparation and opening

The opening of the unique and first National Kafala Center in Egypt represented the main highlight for FACE during 2024.

This new project represents achievements of years of study, advocacy and work in favor of alternative family care in Egypt.

The building of the new center provided by MOSS was assigned formally to FACE December 2023, refurbishment and renovations took place in the beginning 2024, and the center opened on 7th May 2024.

FACE opened the National Kafala Center in collaboration with Ministry of Social Solidarity and Ministry of Health and thanks to the incredible support of EMAAR MISR. This national project provides a single path for newborns who have been abandoned and provides them with the necessary follow-up, tracing, medical, social, and legal support, in addition to the best possible physical and psychological care, thanks to FACE's twenty years of experience in care for extremely fragile newborns. The new center will contribute to promote Kafala in Egypt and to gradually reduce the placement of children in orphanages.

The Greatest Reward of All

Now, I am 28 years old, and I wanted to take this opportunity to thank you. I will never forget the teachers from whom I learned everything".

Receiving messages like this one is heart warming and we wanted to share it with all our supporters. We wish all the very best to Magdy and his family.



Gaza babies and mothers

During 2024, Ministry of Social Solidarity asked FACE to care for 9 children from Gaza who were accompanied by their mothers. The children were received on 17th Jan 2024. Preparations took place to welcome them and provide them with all basic needs, psychosocial support, and medical care for their children. The children of Obour were motivated to welcome and help Gaza babies. The mothers and children stayed in Obour for a week, they left on 24th Jan 2024 to the Admin Capital Hospital as their children needed intensive medical care.

Ministry of Social Solidarity also referred to FACE several babies from the Al Shifa hospital in Gaza who were unaccompanied by their parents. The babies were received from the Administrative Capital Hospital at the NKC in June 2024. The babies accessed to all their basic needs and received emotional and psychosocial support, as well as medical care. The babies are still with FACE until the Ministry is able to identify long-term placement options for them.



Salam Street Children Program Outreach Team

Outreach consists in providing services to a group that might not otherwise have access to those services. A key component of outreach is that the groups of social workers are mobile and meet the beneficiaries in their environment. Compared with traditional service provision, outreach services are provided closer to where beneficiaries may reside, work or hang out, and are entirely voluntary-based.

In 2024, three Outreach groups (15 staff in total) supported children on the streets of Cairo, in 5 detention centers and in 6 of the poorest communities and slums in Cairo. The team provided protection and support to children and families to remain safe and find alternatives to their lives on the streets, or to prevent situations of abuse or risks in these communities and prevent children from working or living on the streets.

FACE Outreach team made over 32000 contacts with 3020 individual children and 645 families over 2024, it conducted 3493 medical interventions, 234 children received legal support, 1975 children received psycho-social support, 2678 children received life skills education.

In 2024, besides its work with children in street situation and in detention centers, the Outreach team continued to develop prevention services in 6 of the poorest communities and slums in Cairo ("El Zarayeb", "Kuwait land", "Masr El Mahrousa" and "Ahlina"). Each area is visited at least once a week and FACE teams provide a variety of services adapted to the context and needs in each community. The objective of the community team is to support children and their families to improve children protection and reduce risks of school dropout, domestic violence, children exploitation through street work, illegal migration for adolescents and young adults…

The new community outreach group provides recreational and arts activities, educational activities and life skills education, legal support, support for schooling, counselling, hygiene and medical support, emergency support, support for job placement and for income generation activities to families, support to access legal support and public services. This new project initiated in 2020-21 is crucial for FACE to support children and families in the current context of economic crisis in Egypt that affects in first place the poorest categories of population, and to prevent children from working/living on the streets.

FACE outreach team also developed several collaborations with local authorities and other local NGOs to contribute to the development of each community: support to local authorities to conduct HIV/Aids detection campaigns, detection of breast cancer and for supporting families to obtain social pension cards, School fees exemptions, IDs...

FACE outreach team also initiated new activities during 2024, due to the evolution of the situation on the streets of Cairo in recent years.

From the second semester 2024, FACE street team observed an important increase in the number of mothers in street situation (324 mothers identified). After observing an increased number of pregnant women, and young mothers with babies, living or working on the streets, mainly due to the growing inflation in Egypt, the team started to adapt some very basic services to support these women: medical care, information about reproductive health and baby hygiene, provision of hygiene materials, nappies, formula milk... This new evolution will be monitored and considered to adapt the team strategy in future years.

As an example, the team provided special support to a pregnant woman, coming from Bangladesh, who was supported by FACE to give birth and to provide medical support to her baby girl, who was born with congenital defect in her esophagus.



Salam Street Children Program Transitional Home

The FACE transitional home (TH) offers children full accommodation, protection and psychosocial support while preparing their social reintegration.

68 children stayed in the TH over 2024, 27 of them joined the home for the first time.

The number of children staying in the TH continued to increase in 2024 (after a decrease of intakes during the Covid-19 pandemic), mainly due to an increasing number of children referred by authorities. 70% of the 27 new children who joined the TH in 2024 were referred by NCCM child helpline, children from National Prosecution office, Ministry of Social Solidarity Social Defense section or from Child Protection Committees. These children were referred to FACE after being victim of severe violence, after their parents were arrested/jailed or murdered, or as part of deviation measures to avoid detention.

Most of these referrals implied very difficult and traumatic situations for children, requiring FACE social workers to adapt the support and the services offered to these children. This new evolution has pushed the team to open the transitional home building's unused floor in 2024, to increase the home capacity and ensure a better separation between young children and adolescents.

The transitional home remains a very essential place for FACE teams (and for children) to provide a safe space for children and youth in preparation of their social reintegration.

Some children study during the day at the FACE Child Friendly School, but it is also essential for them to be involved in social activities outside of FACE.

During 2024, 12 children in the TH attended the FACE child friendly school on a regular basis while 35 children attended the local public school and 4 children joined kindergarten.

5 children were supported to access specific psychological support through external services and 20 children were referred to specialized hospitals to receive adequate medical care.

15 children in the TH were supported for family reintegration and received ongoing follow up from FACE case managers.

Several weekly informal outings are organized for the children, always in the presence of staff.

Regular outings, trips and cultural activities are also conducted along the year to ensure children can leave the home and have access to fun and leisure. Several trips were organised in Al-Qanater Al-Khairiya in the Nile Delta area, in the new Egyptian museum, to the Maadi club, to Cairo zoo, Fagnon farm, or to visit Dell company.

The Reintegration team provides case management support to all children to ensure their reintegration in school, family, employment and society.

FACE Case management team provided counseling and support to 95 families who came to the FACE TH to ask for help or support, with the objective to support families to be able to continue to raise their children and prevent their placement in institutions (gatekeeping).

The team also worked in support to the Outreach team and to the TH team to provide individual support to children in special need for protection or support.

In 2024, 81 new case management files were opened (40% female).

- 159 children were supported for reintegration:
- 15 children were supported to reintegrate back into their family or extended family.
- 67 youth and heads of family were supported to find employment (in Carrefour, medical center, clothing factory, restaurants, security guard...).
- 77 children were reintegrated into school

- 485 children and family members were supported for prevention and other supports:
- 267 children have received support (school uniforms and materials) in order to remain in school and prevent drop out.
- 208 children have received legal support; for birth certificates, identity cards, support for unlawful arrests, proof of genealogy.
- 10 families reached by the community outreach team received support to start up a small business (in sewing, tailoring, cleaning products sales, electricity tools, food and grocery shop, ready-made clothes, mobile library...), benefiting indirectly to 49 children at risk or former street children.

FACE social workers conducted over 369 assessment visits in children families and 857 follow up visits to visit children in their families, schools, and places of work and ensure their safety and well-being after their reintegration.

Thanks to their collaboration, the Outreach team and the Case management team have increased their capacity of employment support and will continue to develop this essential area of work in 2025. This activity is essential for FACE to help and support families and young adults to be independent from FACE support. The team will continue to develop this aspect in future years.



Alternative care / Kafala Program

National Kafala Center

Opening of the new National Kafala Center

During 2024, FACE achieved one of its main objectives, with the opening of the National Kafala Center (NKC) in collaboration with Ministry of Social Solidarity and Ministry of Health. A transition was organized by FACE teams to gradually transfer the babies staying in the FACE Maadi center to the new National Kafala Center.

The building of the new center provided by MOSS (in 15th May City in the south of Cairo) was assigned formally to FACE on 3rd Dec. 2023, refurbishment and renovations took place in the beginning 2024 and the **center opened on 7th May 2024 thanks to the support of EMAAR MISR.**

135 babies stayed in the new National Kafala Center opened from May to December 2024 (57 babies transferred from FACE's Maadi Home and 78 new babies)




Alternative care / Kafala Program

National Kafala Center

The new National Kafala Center provides a single path for newborns who have been abandoned and provides them with the necessary follow-up, tracing, medical, social, and legal support, in addition to the best possible physical and psychological care, thanks to FACE's twenty years of experience in care for extremely fragile newborns.

The NKC serves as a temporary centralized reception and accommodation center for abandoned babies, ensuring specialized newborn care while working toward their best interest by placing them with approved foster families (Kafala families). The center is established to receive and care for abandoned infants of unknown lineage ("Kareemy El Nasab") from one day old up to six months (with exceptions for older children up to two years old). The center will also, in exceptional cases, receive severely abused children, based on a case-by-case assessment for children between one day and six years old, with a total capacity of 200 children at any one time. If fostering is not possible, FACE and the Ministry of Social Solidarity (MoSS) will collaborate with licensed NGOs, and social care institutions registered under MoSS to find suitable placements for the children.

The new center provides high quality services, such as psychomotricity support, baby massages, and ensures high quality nutrition, hygiene and medical care and vaccinations and legal support to all babies to obtain legal documents. The NKC implements very strict child protection guidelines to ensure children protection and safety and create a culture of protection within team and future Kafala families.

Kafala committees and advocacy work

FACE is a member of 5 committees for Kafala (the National Committee and 4 local committees in Cairo, Giza, Qalyubia and Sharqia). FACE attended 20 meetings over 2024 to take part to discussions and evaluations of families requests at the governorate level and national level.

FACE participated to the Kafala Central Committee monthly meetings, during which the committee addressed various requests related to Kafala and discussed a range of complaints raised by families, emphasizing the ministry's commitment to addressing their concerns effectively.

The meetings also entail strategic discussions about Kafala in Egypt (decisions about selecting families, discussing the new training manual, discussing the new alternative law, discussing cooperation of Ministry of Foreign Affairs to follow up on Kafala children abroad. Some case management cases were referred to FACE to help in dealing with it legally.




Alternative care / Kafala Program National Family Reintegration Program

The organisation "Ehtedan", working to promote Kafala in Egypt, invited FACE Kafala Director to attend a workshop on 1st May 2024 to discuss the guidance manual for professionals in the alternative care and Kafala sector, aimed at providing social and psychological support to foster families.

FACE also took part in several workshops organized by UNICEF. These meetings focused on various NGOs' aftercare initiatives, fostering collaboration and sharing best practices to enhance support for individuals in alternative care.

Save the Children organized a workshop on 26th September who invited all NGOs including FACE to review all training manuals (Training manual of staff, and training manual of Kafala families).



Abandoned children Program FACE Homes

136 children (33 girls) have stayed within the 2 FACE Homes in Obour (Since 2003, more than 2910 children have stayed in the FACE centers) and have received a variety of services depending on their needs.

- 76 children stayed in the Obour Home (33 girls)
- 60 children stayed in the new Obour 2 Home (all males)

In September, 6 other young babies were placed by the Ministry's Rapid Intervention Unit, following the closure of an orphanage in Heliopolis.

23 babies were placed folloing the closure of an orphanage by Egyptian authorities in Giza.

16 babies coming from Al Shifa hospital in Gaza were also placed by authorities in the NKC. 9 of them were accompanied by their mothers and 7 were unaccompanied.



Abandoned children Program

FACE Homes

During 2024, the FACE homes have offered a wide range of services to all children staying in the homes: provided 1815 medical acts (1262 in-house and 553 through referrals to specialised hospitals), these consisted of regular medical check-ups, medical care, operations and vaccinations.

Babies and children in the FACE homes and in the National Kafala Center have received a total of 1543 baby massages during 2024, and all children received 4558 psychomotricity support sessions from FACE specialists. All children under 3 and a half years accessed non-formal education, 117 children from the age of 4 years attended fulltime schooling in local schools.

A psychologist was also recruited to provide ongoing support to children in the two Obour homes.

All babies and children join very regular outings in the local garden and neighborhood; Children and young people in the two Obour homes are allowed to go out for walks in evening depending on ages. The two Obour homes also organised a very large number of leisure, sports and arts activities, with a particular attention to ensure girls have similar access than boys to all types of activities. Number of sports activities are organised in the center garden (football, Zumba, Gym...) and with external clubs (Karate, Judo, Taekwondo, Kickboxing...). As every year, summer holidays were organised for all children in a summer resort in Marsa Matrouh during August.



Abandoned children Program Case management - Aftercare

Case Management support

All children received individual support from FACE Case management team to start preparing their future reintegration into family or into independent living.

Weekly case management meetings are organised with social workers and centers management, to support the teams to develop individual plans with each child, and to answer to each child particular needs and plans.

- 78 children joined regular individual counselling sessions
- 25 children were supported to access psychological support from FACE psychologist or through external services.
- One Palestinian girl was received from Mabara Hospital in El Malek El Saleh in January 2024. FACE managed to find the child's mother who was in Cairo and could reintegrate the child with his mother on 11/2/2024.
- One unaccompanied Palestinian boy was received from Arish Hospital on 24 January 2024. The child's family was stuck in Gaza and they reached FACE through the Red Crescent Association, which linked the family of the child with FACE to make sure that the child is safe and sound. The child was finally placed with relatives in Cairo.



Abandoned children Program Case management - Aftercare

Aftercare support

FACE aftercare officer worked with teenagers from 13 years old to help them preparing future plans, creating CVs, finding jobs or internships opportunities, and a number of other support activities to support each adolescent in FACE homes to start preparing their life after FACE.


A training was also offered by DHL company through a specific collaboration with FACE, to organise exposure visits to a group of boys and girls, and to provide a long-term internship to one of the older youths in the Obour 2 home.

A first transitional apartment was opened in 2023 to help 4 young people preparing their independent life in a more independent setting. The first apartment was fully operational in 2024, and the team prepared a new apartment that will be used from 2025 for another group of youth leaving the Obour center.

Along 2024, 14 young people participated in partner NGO (Wataneya) aftercare training, focusing on life skills, psychological support and independence skills (home safety, first aid, health, nutrition, and basic legal and financial knowledge).

Young people over 15 were supported for employment and summer training opportunities at Wadi Degla and other locations, helping them build self-confidence and develop independence.

A four-day camp was organized in Ismailia for 12 boys, in collaboration with Wataneya/Sanad NGO, as part of the aftercare program. The camp focused on equipping the children with essential life skills, preparing them for a smooth transition into independent living.



Abandoned children Program Case management - Aftercare

The Case management team supports children in FACE homes to prepare their family reintegration when possible or a placement into Kafala.

Besides this work, FACE also works at the national level to promote alternative family care and to improve the legal and implementing system of Kafala placement in Egypt.

Family Reintegration and Kafala placements

108 children living in the 3 FACE homes have been placed or reintegrated into family or kafala family during 2024.

- 5 children were supported to reintegrate their family
- 103 children have been placed in Kafala families through the National Kafala Center.
- 55 children were placed in specialized centers to receive services more adapted to their needs (10 young children in small homes and 45 children in other institutions or homes specialized to care for children with special needs).
- During 2024, the case management team has also prepared the registration of 117 children into schools and Kindergartens.

The opening of the National kafala Center in May has helped FACE to increase the number of babies placed into Kafala families. During 2024, 103 babies were placed in Kafala families. This shows the important impact of the new center; it is expected that the new center will contribute to the decrease in the number of children raised in institutions and orphanages in Egypt.



Training Program

In 2024, FACE training team organized 105 days of theoretical and practical training for 466 FACE staff participations in 2024.

FACE training team also conducted 18 days of training to 31 staff of other organizations and to 120 children in local schools.

Internal training

FACE programs training team conducted 105 days of training with 466 program staff participations during 2024. The opening of the new National Kafala center and the recruitment of new staff explains this increase in training provision compared with past years.

Main topics of training: Basic staff training (child development and on FACE target group, basic social work, and communication skills), Case Management, Child Protection policy, Non-formal education and Life skills, basic medical care and Psycho-social support, childcare techniques, psychomotricity and other skills that are essential to maintain high quality services in FACE centers working with babies and young children.

20 staff of the NKC received training from Fire Prevention Representative from Civil Defense Department.

18 new carers recruited for the NKC received special training from MoH for 3 days.



Training Program

Training to partners

During 2024, FACE trainers conducted several trainings to other organisations:

- -5 days Child Protection training to Ghabbour Technical school staff
- -3 days Case management training to Samusocial Egypt staff
- -5 days Training for supervisors of student housing at the Hotel Secondary School in El Gouna
- -5 days training on child rights to 120 children through Salam Child Protection Committee (CPC).

FACE Kafala trainer and NKC teams provided support and training to 104 Kafala families who received children in FACE homes, to train them on childcare techniques and support them emotionally to receive their new child.




Operating Income Repartition

Looking Ahead

In the coming years, FACE will keep focusing on developing the Kafala/adoption in Egypt as it has done the last 15 years. The aim for FACE is strongly on putting more babies into safe and loving families, living in society, rather than filling up orphanages where the children receive no love and are often subject to abuse.

FACE will also continue to develop safety nets for the most vulnerable children and families in extremely poor communities with its prevention outreach team and will continue to explore new communities in needs for support. The aim is to avoid children moving into street situations by supporting the mothers, families, with small busineses or job placements.

We feel, more than ever, full of energy and determination to move forward with our work. FACE has become a solid and reputable NGO in Egypt and our capacity and know-how have grown stronger over the years. The impact we have had over the last 22 years has been massive and we feel strongly the difference we are making. Your trust in us has allowed us to do this. Change thousands of children lives.
